1. Budget vs. Actuals report highlights:

- a. Dues: ~93% of FY26 budget. Council Membership dues run April 1st-March 31st.
- b. Donations:
 - i. Unrestricted donations: ~98% of budget
 - ii. New categories for 2026 following external accountant review: Grants and Donor-Advised Funds (DAF). These donations can be either restricted or unrestricted and are tracked by "class code" in Quickbooks and reported in the Restricted Funds monthly report.
 - iii. Project-specific donations: ~37% of budget; this category is where non-Grant/DAF restricted donations are recorded, the majority of which come from the Giving Tuesday campaign in late November.
- c. CVPC expenses typically skew toward 2nd half of the year.
 - i. All categories currently under budget except for Finance Committee (due largely to timing issue of payment for 2025 Financial Controls Review)
 - ii. Contract signed for Beech Leaf Disease treatment with both contractors, so expect to see those expenses coming through in the 295-Restricted Programs category.

1. BEECH TREE LEAF DISEASE CAMPAIGN

- \$7,015 raised through 4/30/26 (includes 2025). Both vendor contracts were signed with A&A at \$4,255 and Bartlett at \$3,024 = \$7,279. Need to decide if some of the large donations we received this month should be bookmarked for treatment #2 in 2028 or do we just fundraise again at that time or approve to use any surplus reserves the Council has in 2028 (add to 2028 budget).

2. FUNDRAISING

- Thank you to Baltimore Road Runners Club for a \$2,370.96 donation after their Super Bowl Run.
- Mia met with Raul Oteiza, former Scout leader, who has initiated a **\$5,000 donation to CVPC** through Fidelity to use as we see best. He would like **\$1,000 to go to Lifetime membership** and the other as we need it. I walked him around the park for an hour or so, and if the fencing needs additional funds, we thought that would be a good start.
- Bird walk sessions have been highly successful. As of 5/10, CVPC has raised **\$375 in registration donations** and \$9.53 in credit card coverage fees. We need to start leading hikes as well and Margie and Lisa are coordinating one. Raul Oteiza is also interested in leading the “cars of CVPC” hike.

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NOWN REPORT Board Meeting: May 11, 2026 Submitted By: Laura Jenifer

The next NOWN presentation is this Friday, May 15. Jenifer Mallinoff will be speaking about controlled fire burning. There are currently 28 people attending as of 5/11. Margie sent out a social media blast and Mia sent out an email blast so hopefully we have more people signing up this week.

The following upcoming speakers are scheduled:

- **May 15, 2026 – Jenifer Mallinoff** – Controlled Fire Burning –Background – Jenifer Mallinoff works for The Nature Conservancy as a southern Blue Ridge Burn Crew Leader in Asheville, North Carolina. Jen has a Masters of Science in Biology from Appalachian State University. Jen has been a member of the Southern Blue Ridge Burn crew since 2021 and she now leads a crew in planning, preparing and executing controlled fire burns. Jen is also responsible for monitoring protocol for wildlife activity in restored forest sites.

Jen will discuss the history of humans and fire in the eastern United States and the importance of fire in maintaining healthy ecosystem function and to complete plant life cycles. She will explain the process of conducting a controlled burn from the planning phase to implementation as well as the importance of controlled fire burns in the Southern Blue Ridge region which has many of the same forest types found in Maryland and how forests like those in the Cromwell Valley Park could benefit from having fire reintroduced to them

- **September 18, 2025 – Dr. Wayne Bell** – A history of land use on the Chesapeake Bay watershed, from pre-colonial times to the present, and insights that land use changes provide for bird conservation.

Background - Dr. Bell is Senior Associate and former Director of the Washington College Center for Environment and Society. A native of Silver Spring, MD, he graduated from the University of Miami, Florida, and earned his Ph.D. from Harvard University where E.O. Wilson infected him with a lasting love of all things ecological. Retired since 2008, Dr. Bell continues his passion for birds and teaching through the Maryland Ornithological Society Youth program (YMOS), Talbot County Bird Club, and the Chesapeake Forum continuing education program.

- **October 16, 2026 – Carrie Engel** – Native Plants For Fall – Why is fall a great time to plant natives? Which natives have fall color and/or flowers? Which native plants are migrating pollinators attracted to? Let's dive into fall natives and learn about these and other subjects. Samples and a slide show will be included.

Background – Carrie Engel is a long-time garden center employee and gardener. Valley View Farms has been her work home for about 50 years. Carrie appears on the Sunday Gardner weekly with WBAL TV's Ava Marie. Carrie loves plants and the people who nurture them.

- **November 20, 2026 – Kerry Wixted** – Bats – Waiting to receive details of presentation.

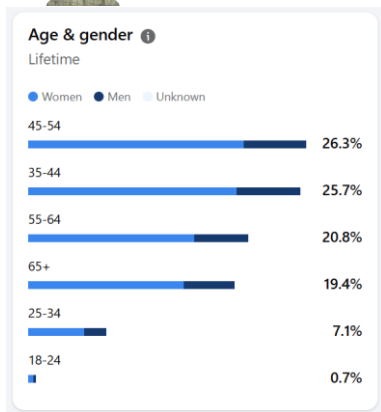
