- 4. Students will be able to create individual phrases expressing the ways in which water moves and impacts their own lives.
- 5. Students will be able to observe and respond to peers using the elements of dance vocabulary to communicate with one another and support their interpretation.
- 6. Students will be able to perform the movement choir and original choreography in collaboration with a student musician and professional local dance company in the spring dance performance.

<u>Description of Partnership with the Historical Society of Baltimore County (HSBC)</u>: We will be partnering with HSBC for their 60th anniversary year, diving into the Smithsonian's Water/Ways travelling exhibit.
