In addition, Willow Grove Natural Center animals were on hand to greet our visitors who learned about how our local wildlife prepares for and survives harsh winter weather. We are grateful to the volunteers who gave of their time and energy for a successful event. We also enjoyed an exhibit of falconry by Judith Spanomanolis which delighted and informed visitors about falcons.

In addition to the exhibits, children participated in making crafts such as binoculars and treats for the migrating birds in their own yards. Many children completed the great Migration Games Challenge and won special prizes. Some were repeat players.

Given the enthusiastic participation of our visitors, we are encouraged to repeat the Celebration of Migration in the future.


