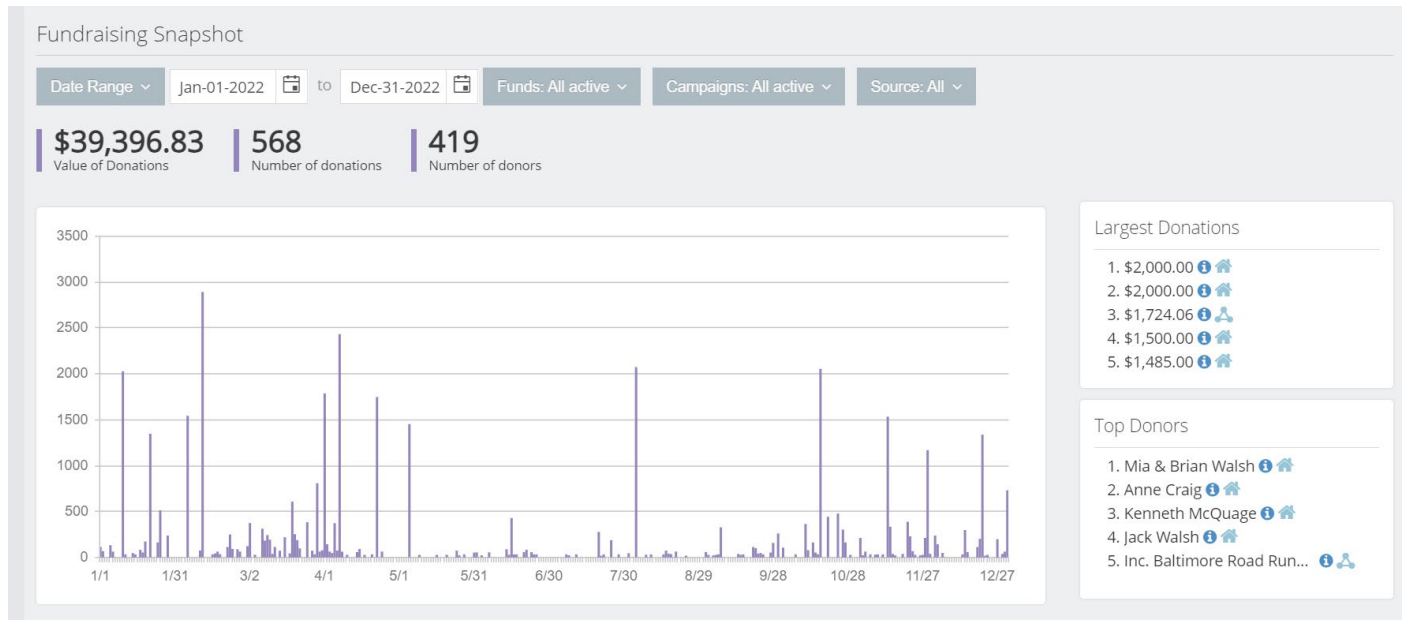

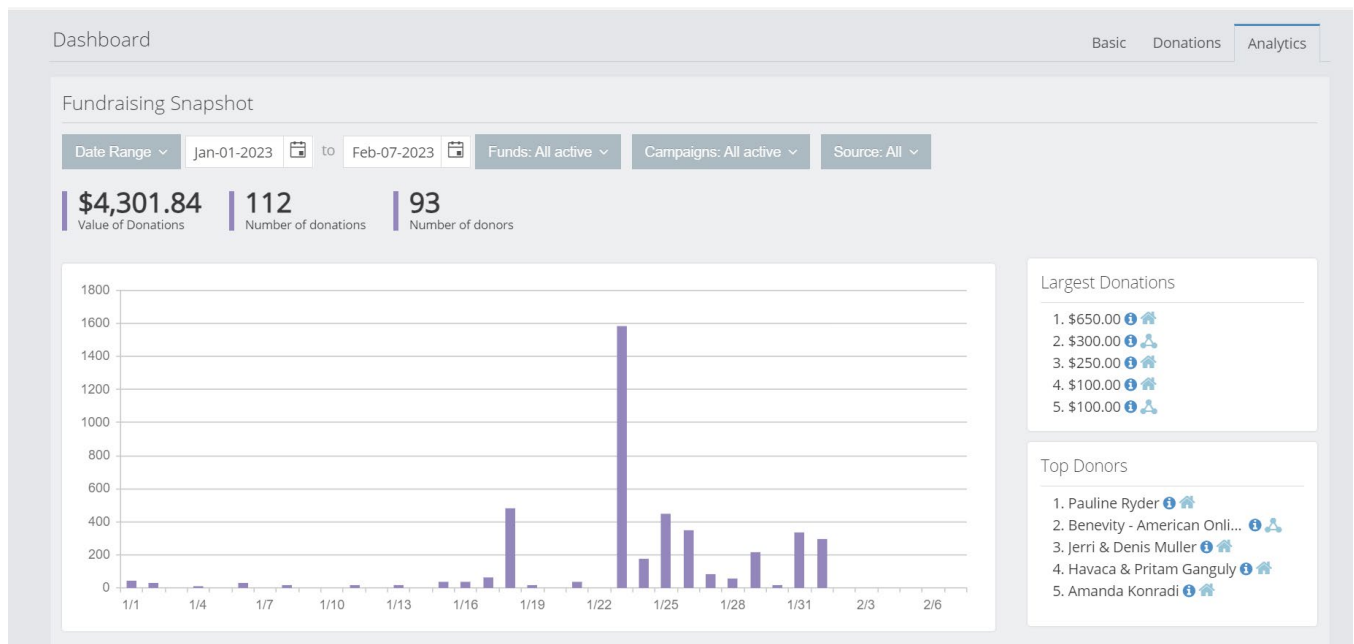

PARK STAFF BOARD REPORT

The winter months have allowed the staff to work on the projects and programs that are upcoming in the New Year. The staff planned, an almost entirely new and ambitious Summer Camp program schedule.

Polly Wog – program is ending this week. Thus, tomorrow and Wednesday are the last two. Staff have been doing some out-reach to local venues. Ranger Anne Wedgeworth, spoke at the school for the blind on Feb 4th to approximately 30 students on Nature. Ranger Breena will be going to the Cockeysville Library February the 25th and providing a program on the end of the winter and what animals are preparing for, and who they might be based on our animal collection.

The Children's garden pond is leaking from its liner. It is possible that the scout project that removed excess and invasive plants from it this Fall that they may have punched a hole in it. If we have to replace that it is going to be quite a job. My recommendation would be to have staff remove animals and plants and have Wicklein's Water Gardens do the installation of a new liner. This is to be investigated further before actually implementing the work.

The program this past weekend, Indigenous Cooking went very well. We have posted many of the pictures. In essence we demonstrated an in ground pit cook (where we placed a chicken and venison roast) and above ground cooking in clay pots. We made a vegetarian stew with corn, beans and squash, and a pot of mint tea sweetened with maple sugar. We even assembled a green wood grille based on drawings of John White from 1585 in the Carolina's; upon which we broiled two fish. The idea being that the fish will cook through before the grille burns threw. All went well. The proteins and sweet potatoes were cut up by staff and then participants would take a tortilla (that were cooked on a clay Comal over a campfire, using a spatula smear a helping of chestnut hummus, on it, then take the other spatula and smear a helping of handmade cranberry sauce on it then a slice of the sweet potatoes and finally a piece of chicken or venison rounded it out. You then popped it into your mouth. Everyone partook of one or the other or both including the soup, which got rave reviews.

The Baltimore Road Runners Super Bowl run went without a hitch, thank goodness with over 100 runners taking part. This had turned into such an ordeal due to the injury they had last summer that had EMS and police and aircraft at the park for really what amounted to a minor injury requiring a few stitches. I breathed a sigh of relief when it ended and no one was hurt, yesterday.

Our spring calendar of events officially opens up for business on the 15th of Feb. Maple Sugaring is this weekend. I'll be there working with Ranger Breena, Alisa, Mimi and Ranger Grace for hikes to the sugar bush, movies of sugar camps, and pancake cooking along with demonstrations of boiling sap, tapping trees and showing folks how they can do this at home. This program is free and runs concurrently from 11AM – 3 PM both days. Sunday will feature Ranger B again, along with Ranger's Anne Wedgeworth, Grace Wiess, Ranger Laura Lechtzin, and Laura Page; same times.

We are still looking for staff for summer. We have only interviewed one person so far. We are posting on Craig's List and flyers posted at Graul's in Hereford. We have also posted flyers at Towson Un. We are also posting flyers at all the traditional colleges of color as well. We do have Sean Rodriguez coming back too. He was an intern last year.
