The purchase of the 220-acre Satyr Hill Farm (now Willow Grove Farm) by the State of Maryland in 1993 was the culmination of 7 years of effort by the Campaign to Save Cromwell Valley. The remaining parcels that now comprise the park were acquired throughout the years since, some as recently as 2008.

Despite these accomplishments, our work is never complete. The continued success of the park relies greatly on many dedicated volunteers, generous donors, and passionate members. From the board to the trail crew to everyone that helps at our events, our beloved park would not be what it is without all of you! Thank you!



CROMWELL VALLEY PARK OVER THE YEARS

Cromwell Valley Park was founded 30 years ago, when the State of Maryland purchased Willow Grove Farm and an adjacent 38-acre plot from the Robert Merrick Estate. Sherwood Farm and undeveloped portions of Good Fellowship Farm were added soon after. Finally, two plots near Providence Road, Barran's Property and Betty's Gardens, were acquired to extend the Park to the footprint that we know today.

Over the years, the County, local historic preservation groups, and many volunteers have worked to restore the 19th century Willow Grove farmhouse and the early 20th century Sherwood House, along with the Lime Kilns that were hidden by brush when the Park was first established. They cleared trails, restored large portions of Minebank Run, and began to document the flora and fauna of the Valley.


